

Regulations of the doctoral summer school “The Psycholinguistics of Multilingualism”

§1.

General provisions

1. Summer School "The Psycholinguistics of Multilingualism", hereinafter: "Summer School" is a project financed from the Integrated Actions Program for the Development of the University of Warsaw, co-financed from the ESF under PO WER path 3.5.
2. The organizer of the Summer School is the Faculty of Modern Languages at the University of Warsaw, hereinafter: the "organizer".
3. **The Summer School is implemented within 10 training days (80 teaching hours) between 20-30.07.2020 at the Faculty of Modern Languages (hereinafter: WN), at Dobra 55 in Warsaw.**
4. **The Summer School will be held in English** according to the program and timetable published on the website: www.zip.uw.edu.pl

§2.

Recruitment rules

1. A participant in the Summer School, hereinafter referred to as "participant", can only be a PhD student at the University of Warsaw who has the status of a PhD student throughout the duration of the summer school. The school is addressed to **doctoral students associated with the faculties of Modern Languages, Applied Linguistics, Polish Studies and Psychology** (recruitment will be for 2 or 3 year old doctoral studies) and doctoral students of Doctoral Schools, with a particular focus on the **School of Humanities and the School of Social Sciences. Doctoral students from other faculties or Doctoral Schools may also apply if they are interested in the subject of the school.**
2. **The first condition of participation** in the Summer School is that the participant has the status of a doctoral student of the University of Warsaw, has interest in the issues of bi- and multilingualism, as well as interest in research on language learning, quantitative methodology and experimental research. Basic knowledge of empirical research methodology and statistics is welcome but not necessary.
3. **The second condition for participation** is knowledge of English enabling active participation in school activities (minimum B2+, confirmed by a language proficiency certificate accepted by the University of Warsaw, participation in a conference or project in English, or an exam at the appropriate level). Knowledge of English will allow participation in lectures and workshops, preparation of projects and reading English-language literature. Participants confirm language competences by sending a relevant certificate, another document or confirming participation in projects or conferences held in English.

4. **The maximum number of Summer School participants is 25, including a maximum of 17 PhD students from the University of Warsaw.** The minimum number of participants from UW is 15.
5. **Admission to the Summer School will start on 11.05.2020 and end on 7.06.2020. The ranking list** of candidates from the University of Warsaw qualified for participation in the Summer School **will be published** on www.zip.uw.edu.pl by **20.06. 2020** at the latest.
6. Within the period specified in paragraph 5, doctoral students interested in participating in the Summer School should:
 - a) **complete the enrolment form**, available at: <https://forms.gle/NEKpZrA1VH6PsACY8>, containing, among others information on the subject of the master's thesis and scope of the doctoral dissertation, courses related to the subject of the Summer School, in which the PhD student has participated so far; motivation to participate in the school with justification and a short description of the achievements related to the field;
 - b) **send scan of a document confirming of the level of English proficiency** (language proficiency certificate accepted by the University of Warsaw; certificate of participation in a conference or project in English; certificate of examination or passing at the appropriate level) to the address: a.otwinowska@uw.edu.pl
7. The ranking list referred to in par. 5 will be created on the basis of the evaluation of applications sent by the candidates, carried out by a three-person Admissions Committee according to the following criteria: a) the adequacy of research and scientific interests for the purposes and program of the school, and b) the expected impact of the participation of a doctoral student in a summer school on the progress in preparing the doctoral dissertation.
8. Scholarship holders of the "Increasing mobility of PhD students at the University of Warsaw" will have priority in qualifying for participation in the Summer School.
9. All candidates will be notified by e-mail about the results of the recruitment immediately after the publication of the ranking list referred to in para. 5.
10. In the event of failure to meet the limit of places intended for UW PhD students, the organizers will conduct additional recruitment rounds, with the dates announced at: www.zip.uw.edu.pl.
11. In the event of a participant's resignation before the start of the classes or on the first day of classes, the candidate from the first place on the reserve list shall be allowed to participate in the Summer School.
12. If the minimum number of participants who are PhD students of the University of Warsaw is not collected, despite the launching of subsequent recruitment rounds, the Summer School will not take place. "at the University of Warsaw" will have priority in qualifying for participation in the Summer School.

§3.

Organizer's rights and obligations

1. The organizer has the right to process personal data in accordance with the rules set out in the information clause contained in the recruitment form.

2. In justified cases, the organizer has the right to change the dates (day and hour) regarding the realization of the summer school.

3. At any time before the start of the classes, the organizer has the right to decide to transfer the Summer School to the next academic year, if required by the epidemic situation and restrictions in the functioning of the University introduced by the order of the Rector of the University of Warsaw. The organizer will immediately inform all candidates or participants of the Summer School about this decision.

4. The organizer provides:

a. classes in accordance with the program and schedule published on the website: www.zip.uw.edu.pl,

b. teaching staff with substantive competence to conduct classes provided for in the summer school program,

c. coffee and lunch breaks for the participant on each training day,

d. a Summer School diploma to participants who have met all the requirements provided for in the summer school program.

§4.

Participant's rights and obligations

1. The participant has the right to:

a. free participation in the Summer School,

b. 10% of absences (i.e. 8 teaching hours) during the entire Summer School.

2. The participant undertakes to:

a. read and accept these regulations,

b. complete and sign the Participant's Declaration which will be provided to the participant on the day of the inauguration of the summer school,

c. participate actively in the Summer School classes in accordance with the program and schedule published on the website: www.zip.uw.edu.pl,

d. punctually arrive at classes within the hours set out in the class schedule, published on the website: www.zip.uw.edu.pl,

e. confirm their presence on each day of the Summer School by signing the attendance list; any absences from individual classes will be noted by the lecturers.

f. participate in the final test,

g. meet the rules for passing the summer school, which are:

- obtaining a positive result in the final test;
- obtaining a positive grade for completing the task envisaged by those conducting the summer school activities.

§5.

Final Provisions

1. The Regulations shall come into effect on the first day of recruitment, i.e. on 11.05.2020.
